Acceptable for recycling:

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Catalogs
- Junk mail
- Phone books
- Paperback books
- Hard bound books (with their covers removed)

PLEASE DO NOT TIE YOUR PAPERS, BOOKS OR MAGAZINES IN BUNDLES.



Corrugated Cardboard and Box Board Guidelines

Corrugated cardboard consists of two pieces of heavy paper (usually brown) with a wavy layer in between. Moving and mailing boxes are usually corrugated cardboard.

Corrugated cardboard and box board will be picked up at the curb. Cardboard should be flattened and folded.



PIZZA BOXES ARE CONSIDERED DIRTY AND SHOULD BE BROKEN DOWN AND PUT IN REGULAR GARBAGE BAGS. WAXED MILK CARTONS AND STYROFOAM ARE NOT RECYCLED.



Plastic Guidelines

Plastic Bottles, Tubs, Jugs, and Jars with symbols 1,2,3,4,5,6,7

PLEASE REMOVE AND THROW AWAY ALL LIDS AND CAPS.

Soda bottles should be checked for NY State bottle deposit markings and placed in the recycling load only if there is no deposit to be reclaimed.



Metal/Aluminum Guidelines

Metal and aluminum cans should be washed clean. Top and bottom lids may be cut away and the cans flattened for easier storage.

Soda cans should be checked for NY State bottle deposit markings and placed in the recycling load only if there is no deposit to be reclaimed.



Glass Guidelines – Clear & Colored Glass

CLEAR GLASS containers should be rinsed clean and loose labels and lids should be removed.

Broken dishes, glasses and window glass are considered garbage and should not be placed with the recycling. To prevent injury, please wrap these items carefully before discarding.
